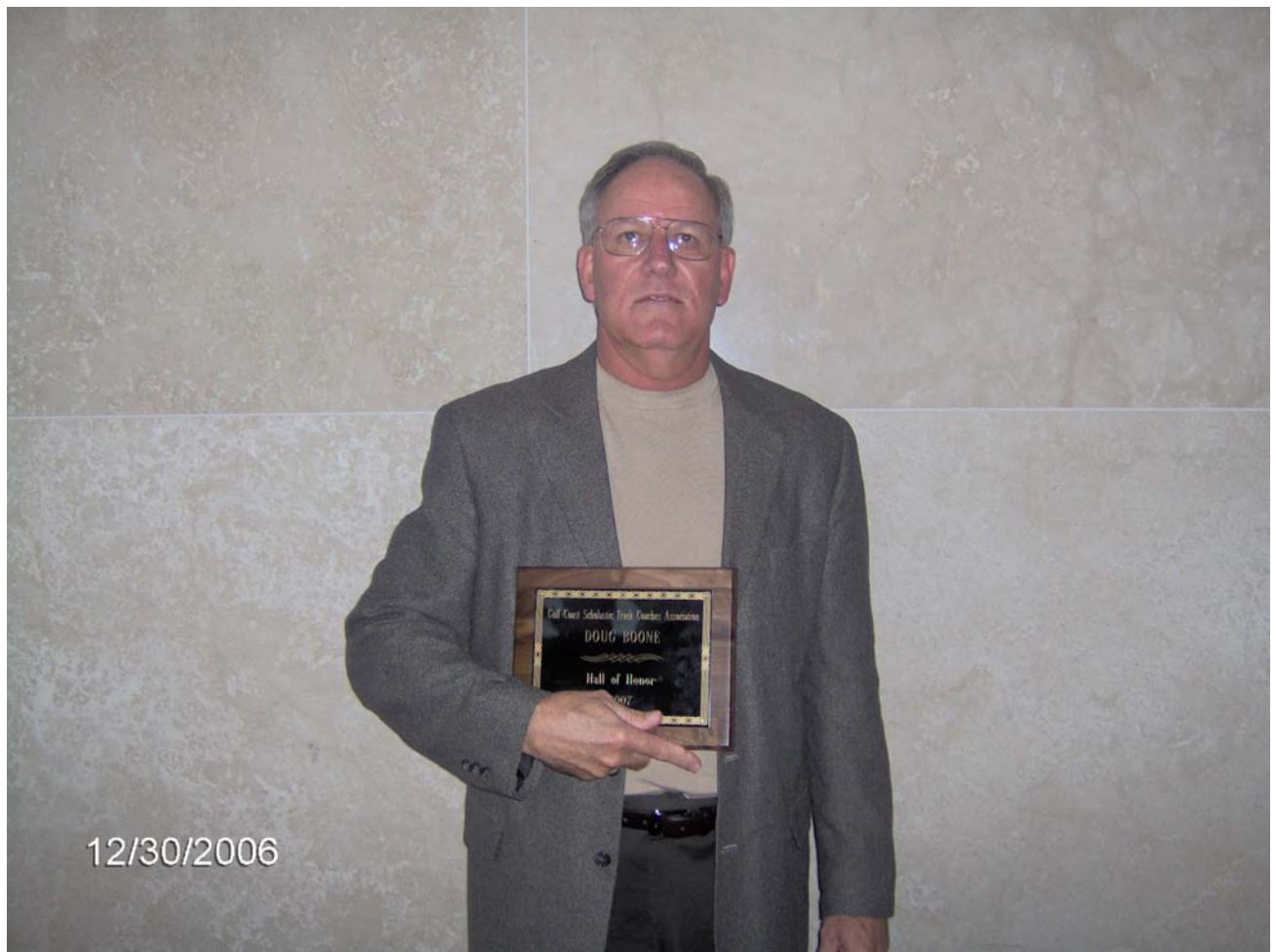

### **Educational Administration Accomplishments:**

- In the year 1995 was selected as the Principal of Brazosport High School. The pervious year the school was given a formal warning by the Texas Education Agency because of low TAAS scores, high dropout rates and low attendance. The school had 63% of the students on free and reduced lunch, 48% were Hispanic, and 13% were Afro-American. There was a mobility rate of 28.5%. The first year the school got a rating of Recognized from the TEA, the drop out rate was less than 1% and the attendance rose to 94%. The school received a Recognized rating for the next three years (1997-99), an Exemplary rating for three years (2000-02) and a Recognized rating for 2003 and 2004.
